
What Does He Do?


Draculastein has been busy working in his basement on



Students shocked; demand explanation from administration

Some people may think of the bathroom as a place of peace and privacy. 





Plague Strikes Home

The boy's lacrosse season was cancelled yesterday after a plague-like disease caused 27 players, and 6 other students, to be hospitalized. The 23 junior varsity and 4 varsity players were reported having black sores along different parts of the body. After a successful first month

of practice, several of the JV team members suffered flu-like symptoms and tenderness in their arms, legs, and scalp.

"At first I thought they were bruises, but then I saw these marks on their cheeks and necks, where bruising is unheard of," Coach Bear said.

Investigators believe the illness is Nowak-Macarski disease, also known as the Cotton Mite Disease. Cotton Mite disease originated in Poland in the early 1800s, and is carried by the mites found in cotton. These mites cling to hair on the body and burrow into the root of the hair, entering the skin. The first strain discovered only caused severe skin irritation and rashes, but a new strain has recently developed. The new strain is said to cause the nervous system to fail.

Bear ordered new JV jerseys from Scrimmage UK, which is one of the leading low-cost jersey manufacturers in the UK and most of Europe. The uniforms are made from a special blend of cotton specifically made for mesh jerseys. The cotton, which originates in Poland, was found to have hosted disease-baring mites. Investigators say the disease traveled through a shipment of the team's equipment from overseas. Upon

athletes receiving the newer uniforms contracted the illness.





Restless Mr. Russell
